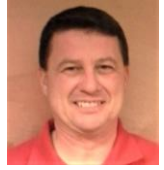

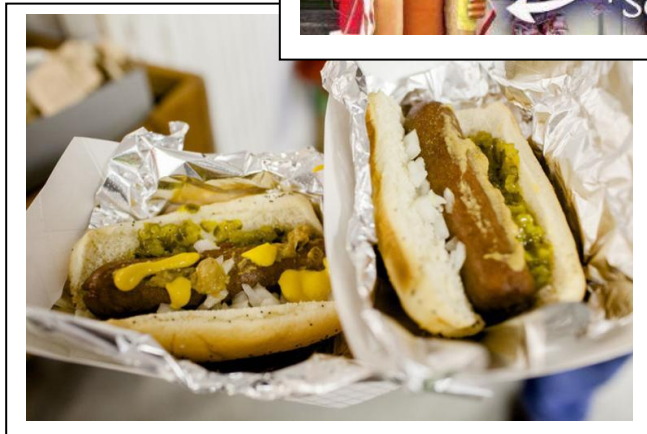
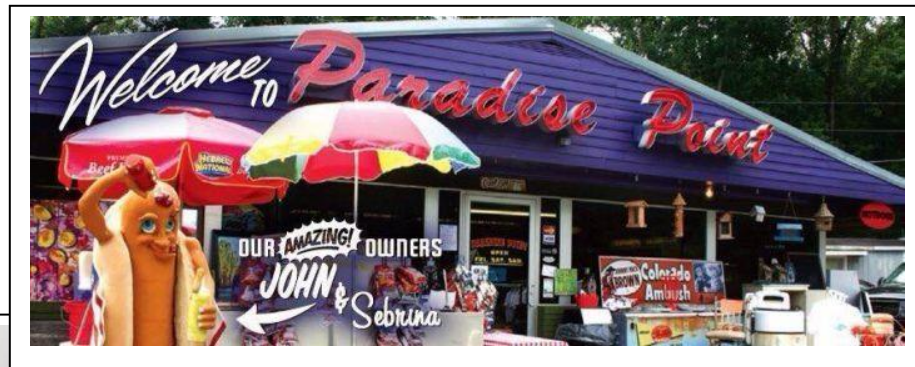
Join us in Paradise

Naming the Baby

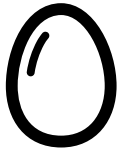

Recipe of the Month

Jelly Omelet



Yes, you read that right. Jelly. Omelet. Jelly omelet! I am guessing that most of our group, like me, had never heard of this breakfast sweet dish. And even fewer among us had ever eaten them at Mom or Grandma's table. So, when I heard Hazel on a recently watched episode (of "Hazel") talk in some detail about this dish, I quickly entered this ancient breakfast item into Google, and voila - jelly omelet! (Just saying those two words together makes me giggle!)

This recipe is mainly how to make a "fluffy omelet" (also a real thing). It requires beating the whites separate from the yolk, and it is put in the oven to finish cooking. Even if you do not want to go the extra mile and add the jelly, you deserve to experience the puffy, light delight of a fluffy omelet.

Ingredients:

- 4 large eggs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 Tablespoon sugar
- 4 Tablespoons warm water
- 1 Tablespoon butter
- 2 or 3 Tablespoons jam (or jelly or marmalade) - for filling
- additional sugar - for sprinkling

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- Separate the egg yolks from the whites. In a large bowl, beat the yolks until thick and lemon colored. Add salt, sugar and water and stir to combine.
- In a separate bowl, beat the egg whites until stiff and dry. The whites should barely slide if the bowl is tilted.
- Heat an **oven-safe 10-inch omelet pan** or skillet over medium heat. Butter the sides and bottom of the pan.
- Gently fold the egg whites into the yolk mixture until well combined. It should look as if the whites have absorbed the yolk mixture.
- Add the combined mixture to the pan. Spread evenly with a spatula. Cook for 3 to 4 minutes. Gently lift the omelet's edge with a spatula after 3 minutes to check for doneness.

- When well "puffed" and delicately browned underneath, place the pan in the center of the oven to finish cooking the top. The omelet is cooked if it is firm to the touch when pressed by the finger. If it clings to the finger like the beaten egg white, it needs to be cooked longer.
- Spread the desired amount of jam, jelly or marmalade over one half of the omelet. You may be tempted to use more jam than is listed. **Resist. Too much jam will create a delicious, drippy mess.**
- Fold the uncovered half of the omelet over the jam. Turn out onto a plate and sprinkle with sugar.
- It makes 1 large omelet suitable for 2 servings.

Susan's Notes

- Take the advice in the above directions and don't put more than a few tablespoons of jelly or jam in the omelet.
- Instead of the sweet treat of jelly, use more common toppings such as cheese, diced ham, or bacon.

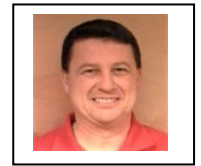
